The case of Santorini” on 28th May 2021. The workshop was the 4th one implemented in the framework of Mo.Na (Monuments in Nature: A creative Co-existence) project and took place both through physical attendance in Santorini and online using the Zoom webinar platform, with the participation of partners and attendees.

HISTORY


Oia is mentioned by many travellers Long before 1650; during the years of Frankish rule in Greece and the Aegean Sea in particular, Oia was one of the 5 castle-towns (called "castellia") of Santorini, i.e. capital of one of the 5 administrative units into which Santorini was divided then.

In a worldwide perspective, Santorini is considered an island of unparalleled beauty as also manifested by millions (2,000,000 in 2018) of tourists visiting annually to enjoy its breath-taking volcanic sceneries; this influx however has been stretching the island's limits beyond capacity, threatening its unique culture and environment.

Despite being a worldwide renowned destination, Santorini enjoys no level of marine protection. Although a NATURA 2000 SCI covers its mountainous SE side and the uninhabited rocky islets of the volcanic caldera, only terrestrial habitat types have been considered in this designation

New paradigms in tourism development are therefore needed, and particularly such that seek to eliminate negative tourism impacts, preserve and capitalize on the natural and cultural local resources, and maximize benefits for local communities and stakeholders.
