Water Framework Directive (WFD)

Article 14 of the WFD requires 'encouragement of the active involvement of all interested parties in the implementation of the Directive.'

- Balancing the interests of various groups
- Enforceability
 - transparency
 - citizen involvement
 - care over implementation

- Diverse sectors and people
- Changes over time
- UK approach:
 - right people, right place, right time
 - keeping them there!

March 2006: Scoping workshops helped develop the framework for PSE


- Development of a core baseline process plan

- Co-facilitated first workshop
- Process designed to work with stakeholders on issues important to them what can you do?
- Building of shared objectives same as WFD
- Engagement = collaborating to work out what we're seeking to achieve
- Consultation = seeking views on an existing plan






Better conversations... better decision-making

- Decide, Announce, Defend the traditional decision making process.
 - Creates a win/ lose
 - No support for implementation
 - No trust and little understanding
- > Participate, Agree, implement
 - More work up front
 - More sustainable decisions
